

5 Signs Your IT Setup Is Working Against You

Your team finds out about security problems after they happen — not before.

Most organizations don't have a clear picture of where they're exposed until something goes wrong. By then the options are more expensive and the timeline is compressed. A proactive baseline — knowing where you stand before an incident — is one of the highest-value, lowest-cost things an organization can have. Most don't.

Onboarding a new person takes longer than it should. So does offboarding.

When it takes days to get a new hire fully set up — or when a departing employee's access lingers longer than anyone is comfortable with — that's not an HR problem or an IT problem. It's a systems design problem. The friction is a symptom of an environment that was built reactively, not intentionally.

You're paying for tools and licenses your team doesn't actually use.

Technology spend tends to grow headcount by headcount, project by project, without anyone stopping to review the full picture.
